
#### **SURVEY RESULTS**

The Georgetown County Survey was conducted by text and online interviews on April 29, 2025 among a random sample of 352 likely general election voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.4 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.









## Q5 How important is it to you that any new development on Georgetown's waterfront includes cleaning up existing land and water pollution?







## Q7 When thinking about the future of Georgetown, what is most important to you?





# Q8 If a candidate for local office only supports a biomass plant as Georgetown's future, would you be more or less likely to support that candidate?




